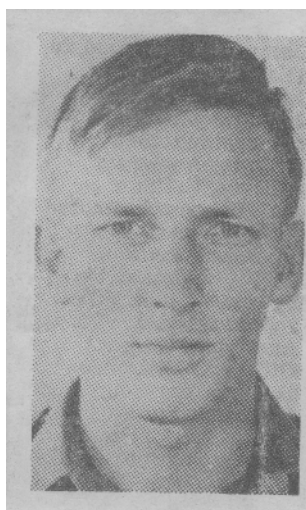


KILLED IN ACTION



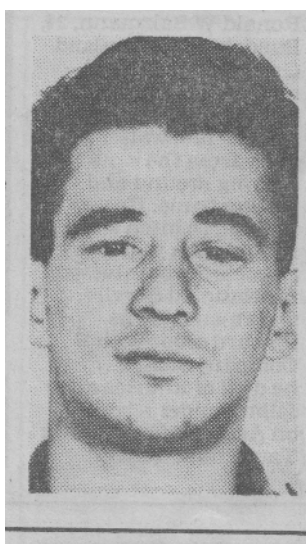
William John Ashton
22, Newcastle, NSW.

He was educated to junior pass level in Queensland, and was working as a salesman when he was conscripted in the first draft of national servicemen. Private Ashton, a rifleman with 6RAR, was killed in action following a mine explosion in the early morning of April 3, 1967 in Phuoc Tuy



Dayle Morrison
22, Maleny, Queensland.

Gunshots from VC troops killed conscript Morrison, who was a timekeeper and pay clerk before his call-up on July 13 1966. Posted to 2RAR as a rifleman private, he died on Australia Day, January 26, 1968, during an enemy contact in Bien Hoa.



Thomas Suter
21, Warwick, Queensland.

The cost clerk who was dux of St Columbans College chose the Army as a career as it offered adventure, travel and fulfilled his sense of patriotism. He enlisted in 1962 and was posted to 1RAR. He was killed when a grenade exploded in unit lines at Bien Hoa on February 27 1966. The lance corporal had just been promoted to second in command of four section, 2 platoon, A company.
